#### Vaccine Clinic - MMUHS

The Mount Mansfield Unified Union School District will be hosting a community vaccination clinic on 2/8/22 and again on 3/8/22 at MMU High School. The clinic will run from 11:30 AM - 3:00 PM both days. This clinic is open to anyone 5 and older. First dose, second dose and boosters will be available. The registration for this is open on the state website. MMUUSD strongly recommends the full series of the COVID-19 Vaccine and a Booster when eligible. If the MMU High School clinic does not work for you, please schedule an appointment at another vaccine clinic or through one of the many pharmacies that are offering the vaccine.

#### **Updates to Covid-19 Procedures**

The Agency of Education (AOE) and Vermont Department of Health (VDH) have been working to provide the framework and resources necessary to change how Vermont's public schools address COVID-19 cases. They recently issued new guidance as we enter the next stage of this pandemic. A primary contributing factor to this policy shift is the rapid spread of the Omicron variant. Many of the strategies that previously were effective for preK-12 schools will cease to be useful and will instead become a drain on scarce resources without a clear public health benefit. In addition, these policy shifts have the support of Vermont's infectious disease experts and pediatricians and are based on sound science.

Based on the VDH's and AOE's updated guidelines and a commitment from the state that schools will have an adequate supply of rapid antigen tests, MMUUSD made the following changes to its COVID-19 procedures, which went into effect on January 20th.

- PCR surveillance testing and Test to Stay will be replaced by the Test at Home program. This includes high school athletics.
- School nurses will offer voluntary rapid testing at school if a student or staff member becomes symptomatic while at school. Schools will require consent from families/caregivers for in-school testing.
- School-based contact tracing will be replaced by notifications to families/caregivers of students who share a classroom with someone who tested positive for COVID-19. Students will receive rapid antigen tests to use at home. The most recent quarantine guidelines can be found <u>HERE</u>.

# **Health Updates - Continued**

#### **Important COVID-19 Prevention Measure - Stay Home When Sick**

Students and staff who are sick should stay home. This is the most important prevention measure.

All students and staff should stay home if they:

- Show symptoms of COVID-19;
- Have a fever (temperature greater than  $100.4^{\circ}$ F); or
- Are currently in isolation due to testing positive for COVID-19.

If symptoms begin while at school, the student or staff member should be tested for COVID-19 and sent home as soon as possible (regardless of test results), and the individual should be isolated from other staff and students until they can go home.

If they test negative (1 PCR/LAMP test or 2 antigen tests as close as possible to 24hrs apart) for COVID-19 they can return to school when symptoms improve and they are fever free for 24 hours.

#### Timeline for K-8 School Choice, Spanish Immersion, & Kindergarten Registration

#### March 2, 2022

MMMUSD Elementary and Middle Schools communicate to parents **Kindergarten registration, school choice and Spanish Immersion** options in MMUUSD and where to access information if they wish to register their child for Kindergarten or apply for school choice or the Spanish Immersion Program.

#### March 2, 2022 - April 1, 2022

Parent(s) or guardian(s) fill out a **school choice or Spanish Immersion** form either online or by printable hard copy. Hard copies must be submitted by mail or in-person to the Mt. Mansfield Unified Union School District Office in Jericho (10 River Road, Jericho, VT 05465).

Parent(s) or guardian(s) register their child for **Kindergarten** on Powerschool. Registration information can be found on the district's website under Families-Community - Enrollment and Student Forms.

#### <u>April 1, 2022</u>

**Kindergarten registrations and School Choice & Spanish Immersion applications due.** If parents want to apply for school choice or Spanish Immersion, all forms are due either electronically, via mail or dropped off in person at the Mt. Mansfield Unified Union School District Office (10 River Road, Jericho, VT 05465).

#### April 29, 2022

Schools will mail letters to parents/guardians informing them if there is capacity for **school choice or Spanish Immersion** explaining placement for their child and general information and timelines for their son/daughter's individual school.

#### Late Spring (elementary schools) /Midsummer (middle schools) 2021

Teacher assignments will occur within each school and letters will be sent home with the teacher placement.

# **REMINDER: 2022-23 Preschool Registration Letter**

Mount Mansfield Unified Union School District is excited to continue providing pre-kindergarten opportunities to families in our district. Please read this <u>LETTER</u> for more information about the pre-kindergarten options and deadlines if you are a resident of Bolton, Jericho, Huntington, Richmond or Underhill. The Universal Pre-K bill (Act 166) entitles all 3, 4 & 5 year olds (not attending kindergarten) to receive 10 hours per week of publicly funded Pre-K for 35 weeks. This education can be in any pre-qualified private program or home-based program with a tuition of \$3,656 paid to the provider by the school district. If a child attends a MMUUSD public school-based Pre-K, the program is free of charge. However, there may be a lottery for school-based programs.

#### **Interested in the Spanish Immersion Program?**

The MMUUSD Spanish Immersion Program will be hosting two informational meetings. Please join us for an opportunity to learn about the option to enroll your rising Kindergartener in the Spanish Immersion Program at Jericho Elementary School and Richmond Elementary School. Teachers and administrations will be present to answer questions and share information.
