WELCOME- Continued:

State officials and medical experts are emphasizing the importance of vaccination in keeping our schools open to in-person learning and reducing the spread and health effects of COVID-19. Therefore, if you are eligible and considering getting vaccinated, I encourage you to do so. There are walk-in clinics happening daily around the state. You can find a location HERE. In addition, Mount Mansfield Union High School will hold a free clinic on September 8th, from 9AM to 5PM (Pfizer 1st and 2nd dose). This clinic is for anyone age 12+, but please note anyone under the age of 18 will need a parent or guardian with them.

In addition to prioritizing the physical health and safety of all of our students, staff and school community, I want to share some of the following objectives that will guide our efforts and decision making in the 2021-22 school year:

School Opening Plan - Updates

On June 14, 2021, Governor Scott ended the pandemic state of emergency for Vermont. This was the result of a high vaccination rate in our state and a reduction in COVID-19 cases. The end of the state of emergency lifted most COVID-19 restrictions and requirements for schools. Therefore, preK-12 education in MMUUSD and across Vermont looks a lot more like it did before the COVID-19 pandemic. This is welcome news to our school community and we extend our appreciation to Vermonters for their willingness to get vaccinated and the effort of state agencies to implement a coordinated vaccination plan.

COVID-19 requirements have been lifted, however, students under the age of 12 are not eligible to get vaccinated and we have seen a rise in COVID-19 infections in our area and state. Therefore, the Agency of Education (AOE) and Vermont Department of Health (VDH) are <u>strongly</u> recommending that preK-12 schools take steps to optimize the safety of students, staff and communities.

A key priority for MMUUSD is to keep students in our school buildings, participating in in-person instruction and learning. We appreciate your attention, cooperation and support in following the components of MMUUSD's 2021-22 school opening plan.

Health Updates & Reminders

MASKS

Please model and practice mask-wearing with your children.

- At this time, staff and students are required to wear masks in all MMUUSD buildings.
- We ask that students come to school wearing a clean mask and have at least 2 extra masks at school. If an additional mask is needed during the school day or you do not have masks at home, there are masks available at each school.
- Gaiters are allowed as facial coverings as long as they are two layers, or folded to make two layers.
- Please do not send in masks with a one way valve.

Health Updates & Reminders

CONTACT TRACING FOR A COVID POSITIVE STUDENT OR STAFF PERSON

When the school is notified of a positive case of COVID-19 within our school community, we will work with the Vermont Department of Health to determine if the person was in school during their infectious period. If it is determined that the person was in school while infectious, we will go through a process of identifying all close contacts during the school day. Close contacts are defined as being within 6 feet of an infectious person for 15 minutes or greater. There are additional factors that are considered when determining close contacts.

- If your student is identified as a close contact you will be notified and provided guidance about quarantine if required. At this time, close contacts who are fully vaccinated and not showing any symptoms of COVID-19 do not have to quarantine.
- This year we will be notifying close contacts differently. We will send out an alert notifying you that your student has been identified as a close contact. You will be notified via text, email and a phone call. There will be a google form attached to the email. We ask you to complete the google form promptly. It is requested that you complete a form letting us know that you received the information. If we are unable to confirm that you received the information, we will try contacting you directly by phone. To make this process work effectively, it is imperative that we have your correct contact information. Please confirm or update your information in Powerschool if you have not already done so.

Please note that an at home test does not qualify as a COVID-19 PCR test.

STAY HOME WHEN SICK

Families are asked to screen their child for illness each day. Children must not come to school if they are sick. If your child has any of the following symptoms, they must stay home:

- Cough
- Fever (100.4 or greater)
- Shortness of breath
- Chills
- Fatigue
- Muscle pain or body aches
- Headache
- Sore throat
- Loss of taste or smell
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea, vomiting, or diarrhea (diarrhea is defined as frequent loose or watery stools compared to a child's normal pattern)

COVID-19 VACCINATION RECORD

Thank you for sending in a copy of your student's COVID vaccination card. This is what we use to calculate the percentage of students vaccinated at each school. If you have not yet sent in your copy of the vaccination card or vaccination record, you can send it to your school nurse. Please note, that this is voluntary request and there is no requirement to send in the copy of the COVID vaccination record. If you have questions, please do not hesitate to contact your student's school nurse.

MMUHS VACCINATION CLINIC 9/8/21

Vermonters ages 12 and older are eligible to receive a free COVID-19 vaccine. We recommend and encourage all eligible Vermonters to get vaccinated. MMU High School will host two additional vaccine clinics this Fall. The dates are 9/8 and 9/29. This is a walk-in clinic with the Pfizer vaccine. No appointment is necessary. This clinic is for both those needing their first vaccine or those needing their second vaccine. The clinic will run from 9 AM - 5 PM. In addition, vaccination appointments are widely available for walk-ins for those 12 years of age and older. ESSER III Grant Funds

ESSER III (aka, ARP ESSER) is a grant that is associated with the American Rescue Plan (ARP). MMUUSD will be awarded approximately \$544,688 later this fall. A major component of how MMUUSD will spend these funds will depend on the feedback received on plans built by the administrative team and feedback from MMUUSD families and community members, including students from historically marginalized families, students on IEPs, and ELL learners. The US Department of Education requires LEAs to engage in "meaningful consultation" and provide evidence public input was incorporated into the plan and the plan must then be approved at the state level and then shared with the public. One way to provide input to the MMUUSD administrative team is through the following Google Form (this form is also found on our website at: https://www.mmuusd.org/district-home/esser). We will continue to collect feedback until the end of October. Additionally, on Monday October 18th from 6:00pm-7:30pm MMUUSD will host a virtual feedback session for parents, community members, students and other stakeholders. Individuals will have an opportunity to ask questions and provide input into how we might best utilize the ESSER III funds. More details for this session will be forthcoming.
